Understanding the Opportunity

My approach focuses on building systems that allow energy and creativity to translate into lasting impact.

Strategic Focus Areas

1. Consistent Community Activation

Expand recurring programs that create reliable reasons for residents returning downtown.

Support collaborative events that benefit multiple businesses simultaneously.

Balance large-scale events with smaller, frequent activations that maintain momentum year-round.

2. Business Relationship Strengthening

Establish regular communication channels with downtown businesses to ensure alignment and shared goals.

Promote cross-business collaboration rather than isolated promotions.

Highlight and celebrate local entrepreneurs to strengthen community identity.

3. Volunteer Sustainability

Develop clear roles and expectations to prevent burnout.

Provide structured pathways for new volunteers to join easily.

Recognize and celebrate volunteer contributions to maintain engagement.

4. Clear Downtown Identity

Promote Woodbury's authentic character rather than adopting external models.

Highlight local stories, creativity, and community-driven initiatives.

Align marketing efforts to create a consistent narrative across events and outreach.

5. Infrastructure for Long-Term Growth

Develop repeatable systems for event planning, reporting, and partnership management.

Strengthen grant alignment with measurable community outcomes.

Support organizational stability through clear processes rather than individual dependency.

Proposed Leadership Structure

Given my existing deep engagement within Woodbury and ongoing community initiatives, I believe a phased leadership approach offers significant advantages. Beginning with part-time Executive Director leadership over a two-year horizon would allow for thoughtful infrastructure development, relationship strengthening, and sustainable program growth while maintaining organizational continuity.

Woodbury's greatest strength is its authenticity — a community where relationships matter, and local identity drives participation. My goal is to help connect existing energy into a cohesive framework that supports long-term vitality while honoring the people who already make this downtown special.
